ITINERARY

Monday

You meet your coach, and travel to Dublin to join the morning ferry crossing to Holyhead. On arrival you will travel to your hotel in Mold, with comfort stop in Llandudno en route arriving late afternoon with time to relax and refresh before your evening meal.

Tuesday

This morning, you take the coastal route passing the seaside towns of Colwyn Bay & Llandudno to the historic town of Caernarfon, with a visit to the castle which dominates the town. Afterwards board the "Queen of the Seas" cruise, a perfect way to enjoy the changing landscapes of Snowdonia with magnificent views of the Isle of Anglesey and Caernarfon Castle.

Wednesday

Today you travel to the Ffestiniog Railway, operated by the oldest independent rail company in the world, taking you on a spectacular journey through mountainous Snowdonia. Later that day your coach takes you to the nearby village of Portmerion for free time before returning to your hotel.

Thursday

After breakfast you head south via the Horseshoe Pass to Llangeollen and board the canal boat taking the peaceful cruise along the Dee Valley, with a live commentary from your skipper explaining the history and local knowledge along the way. The journey ends after you pass over the famous and thrilling Pontcysyllte viaduct built in 1805 towering over 128ft above the River Dee. Join your coach again at Froncysyllte returning through the Llantysilio Mountain range with free time in the charming market town of Ruthin.

Friday

This morning after breakfast and checking out, you will leave your hotel and travel to Holyhead to join the early afternoon ferry crossing to Dublin Port. On arrival, you will return to your original joining point.
